Baroque Drawing in Italy

Drawing has been seen as an essential element in the stylistic revolution that gave birth to baroque art in Italy, particularly in the work of the Carracci. Carel van Tuyll, former Director of the Department of Graphic Art at the Louvre and the author, most recently, of the forthcoming *Italian Drawings of the Seventeenth Century in the Teyler Museum*, will lead this day-long seminar focusing on Italian Baroque drawing, to be taught primarily from works in the Morgan's collection.
