






Mark Twain (Samuel Langhorne Clemens), *Pudd'nhead Wilson*, autograph manuscript, 1893.








7 Mark Twain, Life on the Mississippi. Boston: J. R. Osgood, 1883. The Morgan Library & Museum; PML 16789.












